

CAROLINA SPIRIT QUEST'S 7TH ANNUAL SPRING EVENT

"BRINGING HOME THE MAGICK"

Each year since 1996, Carolina Spirit Quest has presented a weekend of workshops, community building, drumming, dance, and ritual for pagans in the Carolinas, Virginia, and beyond!

This year we cordially invite you to embrace the theme "Bringing Home the Magick" with a series of workshops, discussions, and events that will help you make each moment a little more spiritual, and help you learn how to bring the magick home to your daily life.

WHERE & WHEN?

Carolina Spirit Quest Spring Event will be held April 12-14, 2002 at Millstone 4-H Camp in Richmond County, NC. State owned and operated through the Department of 4-H Youth Development, Camp Millstone features cabins, showers, a co-op kitchen, two fire circles, and a breathtaking view of the North Carolina wilderness.

Alcohol and drugs are *not* permitted.

WHAT DO I GET OUT OF THIS?

A full weekend of excellent meals coordinated by Chef Bill Elston, three days and two nights in a picturesque, rustic camp cabin, a hot shower every morning, and an uninterrupted time where you can learn, teach, and build community with friendly, like-minded folk!

PLANNED EVENTS

This year, the Staff of Spring Event 2002 has cooked up a delicious smorgasbord of workshops, classes, discussions, rituals, and events for you to explore!

The Zells: CSQ is honored to have Oberon and Morning Glory Zell-Ravenheart as special guests. The Zells will conduct an Intensive Workshop on Polyamory and two additional workshops during the weekend.

Rituals: This year's main ritual will focus on deep shamanic workings. It will be a participatory event for the entire family and will even include ritual roles for interested children.

Workshops: CSQ 2002 will have several new workshops (flute making, introduction to paganism, pagan parenting, and more) but will also bring back a couple of old favorites (drumming and spiritual sauna as a sample). We will also be providing suggested workshop combinations such as "Paganism for Beginners" and "Aspects of Shamanism" for those who just can't decide. A complete description of all the workshops will be available on the website by Yule.

Children's Workshops: CSQ 2002 has three children's programs that will be available during each workshop session. These are for Infants and Toddlers age 0-4, Children 4-12, and Teenagers 12-16. Your children will be able to meet and interact with other children their own age with similar beliefs in a safe environment.

Featured Guests: Oberon Zell-Ravenheart and Morning Glory Zell-Ravenheart

Oberon Zell-Ravenheart co-founded the Church of All Worlds in 1962.

First to apply the terms "Pagan" and "Neo-Pagan" to the newly emerging Nature Religions of the 1960s, and through his publication of *Green Egg* (1968-1975; 1988-96), Oberon was instrumental in the coalescence of the Neo-Pagan movement.

In 1970, Oberon formulated and published the theology of deep ecology that has become known as *The Gaia Thesis*.

Oberon is the primary sculptor of The Mythic Images Collection, producing museum-quality replicas and beautiful original altar figurines of Gods, Goddesses, and mythological creatures.

Morning Glory Zell-Ravenheart, Elder Priestess of the Church of All Worlds, was ordained in 1974, and co-founded the Holy Order of Mother Earth in 1978.

She is a Goddess Historian, Loremistress and Priestess of the Great Goddess in Her many guises, traveling and lecturing with her extensive collection of Goddess figurines, some of which she sculpted herself.

She and Oberon have been together for 27 years, and are now in a group marriage of six people. The term "polyamory," applying to multiple loving relationships, was coined by Morning Glory in 1990, and has been entered into the Oxford English Dictionary.
