Workshops

Yggrunar: Runes of the Ecstatic One Presenters: Danny Moses and Dan Campbell



In this workshop we will delve into the lore of the Runes. We will start by introducing the Runes themselves in the context of Scandinavian creation myth, and dwell briefly on Odin, Freya, and a few other deities. The heart of the workshop will be a discussion of the three Wells of Wyrd and the relationship between fate and the carving of runes. The last two hours will cover divination and magical work with the Runes. The last hour will involve Rune readings in which each person will have an opportunity to cast the Runes and the rest of us will read them.

A companion booklet on the meanings of the Runes and various other materials will be provided. You may wish to bring pen and paper to take notes.

Healing Through Five Senses Facilitator: Sharon




In this workshop we will explore the use of varied healing modalities from different traditions and cultures, through the framework of the five senses. This Workshop will provide information about


