Children's Learning Circle - Elements for the Community

#### **Cooking for the Seasons**

I am Pagan and I use the bounty given to us by The Goddess and God to create dishes to share with loved ones. I use these bounties to keep my foods fresh and healthy. Come and find out how you can create dishes easily and inexpensively using foods available from our own gardens, or the gardens of others throughout the seasons. We will also be cooking up a desert from the CSQ cookbook during this workshop to help nourish our CSQ community (if you don't know much about cooking don't worry we'll help you along and we'll have tons of fun in the process).

#### Magic from the Garden – Herbal Magic

Herbs have been used for centuries to enhance the power of spells and magic. In this Learning Circle, we will look at some common herbs, such as Rosemary, Lavender and Sage, and their use in magical work. We'll explore using herbs in candle magic, charms, poppets and other magical uses. This is designed as a beginning level class – no prior knowledge of herbs or magic is necessary.

#### **Prayer flags - Symbols and Prayers**

A short history of prayer flags, their symbolism and tradition, and a chance to make/decorate your own flags. Prayer flag tradition dates back to ancient Tibet, China, Persia and India. Believed to have originated with the Bön, which predated Buddhism in Tibet. Traditionally used to promote peace, compassion, good fortune and wisdom. The prayers and mantras on the prayer flags when blown by the wind spread good will and compassion into all pervading space bringing benefit to all. Traditionally they are woodblock printed with texts and images. The five flag colors are blue, white, red, green, yellow – symbolizing sky/space, air/wind, fire, water, earth. Using your own intentions, decorate flags with prayers or pictures of your choice.

#### **Presenter Bios**

Becky Starr is an instructor by passion and training with interests in many areas. Currently, she is in the final stages of opening Starrlight Mead, a honey winery, expected to open in Spring 2010 in Pittsboro, NC. In the Pagan world, she finds herself a frequent workshop leader for Celebrate the Circle, the CUUPS chapter of Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Hillsborough, and at events for Carolina Spirit Quest, including both Spring Quest and Winter Quest. Becky is a past President and Vice President on the Board of Trustees for CSQ. Becky is an eclectic pagan, a Priestess of Isis and Freyja, and has been working with the tarot for about 10 years.

Ben Starr has made more than 150 gallons of mead. Ben and Becky are opening a commercial meadery, Starrlight Mead, in Pittsboro later this year. Ben has won several awards for his mead, including Best in Show at the International Mead Festival. Ben has taught several mead making classes for Quest, beekeeping organizations, brew shops, and anyone else who will listen.

**Chrissy Forsythe** is an eclectic Pagan from Pittsboro, NC. She started on her path back in high school and has been slowly incorporating much of what she

### Celebrating the Joy Within - Rituals

Rituals are the heart of any Carolina Spirit Quest event. Spirit is our middle name, pun intended. This year's rituals have an elemental theme and will weave the energy of the rituals, the spiritual element of Spirit Quest through all the activities of the weekend. You are welcome to choose an elemental cohort (think temporary,

time limited coven) during the opening ritual, or you may spend some time prior to quest meditating and working with elemental energies in order to maximize this opportunity. Of course, as we all know, Spirit may change your plans, but if you wish to prepare to work a particular path, you may bring ritual garb and altar items to support your expression of this element.

We will have much fun as we nurture our Spirits and share spiritual nurture with the community. As in everything in life, you receive in direct proportion to what you bring, so bring big cups to fill and share as we celebrate the Elemental Energies and Powers of our pagan path.

As Spring Quest is a family event, children are welcome at all rituals. No special dress is required for the rituals, although many people do enjoy dressing up in their favorite ritual attire.



### **Opening Ritual**

In our Opening Ritual Friday evening, each attendee, including the children, will be asked to join an elemental cohort: Air, Earth, Water, Fire or Spirit. They will work with this cohort all weekend to deal with the issues this element represents, embody the powers of the element, and teach the rest of the community more about the gifts and challenges of the element.

#### **Main Ritual**

In the Main Ritual Saturday evening, each participant and each cohort will deepen their understanding and relationship with the elemental energies they have chosen to work this weekend and create an opportunity for the community to experience this energy. This takes advantage of the truth that we learn by teaching and we only truly know that which we can teach others.

### **Closing Ritual**

In our Closing Ritual Sunday afternoon, we will gather in our small groups one last time and express our gratitude and speak the intentions we will carry home with us. We will honor and acknowledge the relationships formed and work done this weekend.

Feel free to wear your traveling clothes as we head back to our daily routines.

### **Self-Guided Ritual Opportunities**

Camp Royall is a beautiful, spiritual place. If you would like to conduct a personal or small group ritual, please let the CSQ staff know. We are happy to help you find a space for your rite.



### Children's Program

The CSQ family is growing every year. We invite you to allow your children to take part in their own separate, special program designed with just them in mind. This is most appealing to children age 12 and younger.

This year the children's program will be organized by **Cynthia Campbell**.

#### **Learning Circles for the Children**

Children's Learning Circles will be offered during the normal Learning Circle times on Friday afternoon, Saturday morning, Saturday afternoon, and Sunday morning. You can drop off your children at the children's workshop area 5 minutes before Learning Circles are to begin to allow you to be on time for your workshop. All children will need to be picked up within 10 minutes of the end of the scheduled Learning Circle times. Please remember to sign in your child/ren when they are dropped off and sign them out when picked up.

Some snacks and a drink will be provided during Children's Learning Circles, but you may bring any drinks or snacks you would like for your child (please label them with your child's name).

Assistants are needed during the Learning Circle times, and parents are encouraged to sign-up. This represents an opportunity to play with the kids during your community service shift!

#### **Planned Activities**

#### Saturday Morning Elements for the Community

The children will help decorate quilt squares in elemental colors that will become a permanent altar cloth for our community altar and our ancestor bowl. This quilt will travel to all Quest events, and is destined to become one of our community's sacred items.

#### Saturday Afternoon Wearing the Elements

The children will be decorating themselves with body art using henna, temporary tattoos, and/or face paint, with our elemental ritual groups in mind. We will have the children decorated and ready for the main ritual Saturday evening!

#### **Sunday** Taking the Elements Home

The children will be making an altar item – or items – to represent the element they will be working with during the weekend, or they may choose to make an altar set of items representing each of the elements. We will also burn discs with pictures of the children's weekend to take home.

**Meal Times and Snacks:** Children are encouraged to gather at the bell before lunch and dinner with their parents - we will have a brief announcement session and blessing of the meal. Then children (with an assisting parent if necessary) will be at the head of the serving line. Also, look for the popular snack table, that is accessible in-between meals, for children of all ages!

**Photos:** Throughout the weekend we will be taking photos of the children that will be used to make mementos of their time at Quest in the Sunday morning workshop. If you would prefer that no photos are taken of your child, please let us know when you sign them in.

**Clothing:** Keep in mind that kids will get messy during planned activities, so dress them accordingly and bring a spare change of clothes and shoes to the Children's Learning Circles.

### **Miscellaneous Information**

#### **Camp Royall**

Camp Royall is located near Pittsboro in central North Carolina , about a 4 ½ hour drive from the northeastern part of the state and a 6 hour drive from the extreme western part. Camp Royall is a little less than 20 miles from I-40 at Chapel Hill. Camp Royall has gently rolling terrain with all walks and paths between buildings and amenities on a grade of 5% or less, making it completely wheelchair accessible. While woods surround the site, there are several large open areas. Camp Royall is located on the site of an old family farm. Sights and sounds (rather the lack of noise) of rural North Carolina abound. The dining hall and gymnasium face a small pond. Camp Royall opened in 1997.

Some of the site buildings include: Dining hall, craft center, gymnasium, pool and bathhouse, playground, basketball court, volleyball pit, playing field, campfire circle and another outdoor circle near the cabins, small pond, hiking trails. The Dining hall contains a nice large fireplace at one end and a front porch complete with rocking chairs at the main entrance. The dinning hall has nice windows all around to give you a lovely view from any spot.

Break out space is at a premium. There is a large covered pavilion, the mess hall, craft building, and common room within each cabin. This would give us space for six workshops and vendor village. Not to mention the hiking trails, fire circle, dock, and many more spots for quiet reflection.

Also at Camp Royall our children can truly be children at the large playground area featuring swings, sandbox, slides, a small ropes course, and plenty of room to run.

#### Lodging

Maximum capacity at Camp Royall is 116. Camp Royall has four cabins, two that sleep 30 and two that sleep 28 and each featuring a common room, bunk beds, and several private rooms. All of the of the cabins have ramps and are handicapped accessible. Linens are NOT provided, please bring your own linens or sleeping bag, pillow, and towels. Each bathroom has private toilet and shower stalls and is handicapped accessible. Also, there is air-conditioning in all buildings except for the bathhouse at the pool.

Limited tent camping space is also available; please contact us for further information.

There will be **NO flame or fire of any kind in the cabins**, this means no incense, candles, or smoking.

### Carolina Spirit Quest Rules

- Consent Requirement "It is the responsibility of the initiator of any sexual or other physical contact to positively ensure that consent is given before engaging in such contact."
- No pets.
- To ensure the safety and well-being of all our members, we ask that parents maintain supervision of their children at all times unless other arrangements have been made. If a child is overly disruptive during the Children's Learning Circle times, the parent will be notified within their own Learning Circle and requested to remedy the situation.
- Certain areas such as the kitchen can be dangerous for our younger participants, and because of this, these areas will be placed off limits. We request that, for your children's safety, you make sure they abide by these rules.

### **CSQ Annual Meeting - Nominations and Elections**

According to the Bylaws, three (3) At-Large Board Members shall be elected each year at Spring Quest. Further, elected trustees take office immediately after Spring Quest, serve terms of two (2) years, and may serve not more than two consecutive elected two-year terms.

Trustees must attend Spring Quest, and all meetings of the Board held during their terms of office. Currently there are four meetings per year - scheduled for Friday night, Saturday all day, Sunday to mid-afternoon in May, August, November, and February. Board meetings must be held within North Carolina, South Carolina, or Virginia. The next Board meeting will be May 21-23, 2010. Board members are expected to make every effort to be available for emergency meetings and/or conference calls, and respond promptly to messages from other board members.

Nominations must be delivered to the Secretary, Steph Byrd, not later than 9:00 AM EST Sunday, April 18, 2010. They must be in writing, stating the full names, addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses of both the nominee and three nominators. The nominators must certify that the nominee is willing to serve on the Board. The nominee and nominators must be members of Carolina Spirit Quest in good standing and present at Spring Quest.

Voting takes place during the Spring Quest by written ballot. All members in good standing who are eighteen years old or older who registered for the Spring Program by Midnight (12:00 AM) of Friday, April 18, 2010 are eligible to vote. Absentee voting is not allowed. Nominees must attend the Spring Quest at which they are nominated.

Therefore, nominations are open for three (3) two-year terms.

The duties of the Board are:

- Make overall policy, direct and control CSQ affairs
- Appoint a Treasurer, who may or may not be an elected trustee
- Appoint the Director(s) of the program(s) for the current year
- Appoint the Director(s)-elect for the following year
- Approve the budgets
- Be willing to help with the work of the Board.

The officers of CSQ are a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Treasurer is an appointed position, who may or may not be a current member of the Board. The Treasurer's term runs from August 1 to July 31. The Board names the Officers.
